FROM THE POST SERVICE OFFICER:

Retroactive Toxic Exposure Benefits Deadline Approaching

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) wants veterans to be aware veterans who apply for the PACT Act payouts within a year of the bill signing are potentially eligible for retroactive benefits back to that date. But veterans who enroll after August 9, 2023, will only receive payouts back to their date of filing. Since the PACT Act was signed into law on August 10, 2022, more than 660,000 veterans have applied for benefits, and the VA has paid out more than \$1.4 billion in benefits.

The law provides presumptive benefit status for 12 types of cancer and 12 other respiratory illnesses linked to burn pit exposure in the Gulf War, the War in Afghanistan and the War in Iraq; hypertension and monoclonal gammopathy of undetermined significance (MGUS) for veterans who served in Vietnam; and radiation-related illnesses for veterans who served in several new locations in the 1960s and early 1970s. Veterans or their family members can also get information about PACT Act benefits by visiting the VA's website or by calling 1-800-MYVA411 (1-800-698-2411).

"When I Am Afraid"

Have you ever been afraid of the dark such as the pitch-dark night, life-threatening illness, someone threatens your life, challenging experience, or anything that scares you? I have had many, many scary moments in my journey. Here are three personal examples:

The **first** one was when I was growing-up poor in a remote village called "Hacienda Locsin," in Cadiz, north of Negros Occidental, Philippines. The house, built by my uncle and father, was simple "modest" home in the village. The houses on the estate provided by the owner of the hacienda (estate) for sugar cane workers. Our

house was without electricity nor running water. We fetched water for cooking, washing, and showering. We used kerosene lamps at night. I do not even recall if we had a flashlight. It was really frightening dark at night with no streetlights. I was always afraid of the darkness of the night. I always look forward to the full moon on a clear night. "Fear of the dark is a common fear or phobia among children and, to a varying degree, adults."

The **second** time was in Winter 1993 during the "helicopter egress training" on board Naval Air Station Miramar. I and my fellow Marine and Sailor were scared. The trainees were blindfolded before entering inside the barrel which turned around multiple times and down at the bottom of the pool at least sixteen feet. I was afraid of the darkness and did not know if I was going to survive underwater. Everyone received instructions that before the two-day training that one of the previous trainees died during the "routine" training. It was "realistic simulation as if the helicopter went down under water at night. The "Helo Dunker Training" was a scary experience indeed. I said a lot of prayers to pass the test. Moreover, you must be an exceptionally good swimmer. Two years before this training, I barely passed my swimming test during my Officer Training in Newport, Rhode Island in April 1990. By God's grace, I did receive a certificate of a successful completion of the helicopter egress training in San Diego, CA.

The **third** time was in January 2005 when I was serving as Deputy Command Chaplain of Operation Iraqi Freedom-2. It was completely dark when we hit our racks at night. I was always scared not only of the darkness, but also when the Chinese made rockets coming down from outside the fence. We had dozens of fatalities and casualties including

three direct hits on the unprotected trailers, our temporary dwelling places. My last three days in Baghdad, Iraq was very scary. During a pitch dark, cold night in January 2005 I ran into a super reinforced solid concrete wall. It resulted in losing lots of blood. I also fainted. I had facial and dental injuries. The duty dentists tried to help me; however, they could only perform certain treatment. It was a very painful experience. I had to be medevac (Medical Evacuation) from Baghdad to Balad, Iraq then to Landstuhl, Germany. By God's grace, after two weeks, I ultimately made it back home to Okinawa via Bethesda, MD.

There is a story in the Bible about David. He was afraid of King Saul. 1 Samuel Chapter 27 tells of the story of David fleeing from Saul. He decided not to stay in Israel anymore because of the dangers and pursuit of Saul. David said, "Someday Saul is going to get me. The best thing I can do is escape to the Philistines. Then Saul will stop hunting for me in Israelite territory, and I will finally be safe." (Verse 1)

Verse 2 So David took his 600 men and went over and joined Achish son of Maoch, the king of Gath. ³ David and his men and their families settled there with Achish at Gath. David brought his two wives along with him—Ahinoam from Jezreel and Abigail, Nabal's widow from Carmel. ⁴ Word soon reached Saul that David had fled to Gath, so he stopped hunting for him. (Verses 2-4)

When David became King of Israel, he recounted his experience being afraid when King Saul wanted him dead.

Psalm 56:1-13 is a psalm of David, regarding the time when he was fleeing from King Saul and the Philistines seized him in Gath.

Psalm 63:1-11 is like the story above but in a different location of David fleeing from King Saul. "Engedi is perhaps best known for being a hiding place to which David fled when escaping King Saul's murderous intentions (1 Samuel 23:29-24:2)." Engedi means "Spring of the Goat Kid" in Hebrew and is the name of an oasis in the desert west of the Dead Sea near Masada.

"When you and I are afraid," what should we, or must do?

First, "When I am Afraid," Trust in God! Psalm 56:3-4, state, ³ "But when I am afraid, I will put my trust in you. ⁴ I praise God for what he has promised. I trust in God, so why should I be afraid?

What can mere mortals do to me? ¹¹ I trust in God, so why should I be afraid? What can mere mortals do to me?" When David was afraid, he put his trust in God.

Trust is a very important word. "In God We Trust" is inscribed in every U.S. currency such as the 50 cents coin. "A law passed in July 1955 by a joint resolution of the 84th Congress (Pub. L. 84–140) and approved by President



Dwight Eisenhower requires that "In God We Trust" appear on all American currency. This law was first implemented on the updated one-dollar silver certificate that entered circulation on October 1, 1957.[8] The 84th Congress later passed legislation (Pub. L. 84–851), also signed by President Eisenhower on July 30, 1956, declaring the phrase to be the national motto." It is important for the Americans since the founding of America.

Trust is vital in David's walk with God. He would not have survived without a total trust with the living God. Trust is an antidote to his fear of his enemies. David said, "when I am afraid, I will put my trust in you" (verse 3). He repeated twice of his fearless heart saying, "I trust in God, so why should I be afraid? What can mere mortals do to me? (Verse 4b) and in verse 11, he said "I trust in God, so why should I be afraid? What can mere mortals do to me?"

Trust is an essential act of faith and total trust to God by Bible believing believers from the first century to the 21st century history of Christianity. When you are afraid of anything or any foe, simply put your trust in God! You can always count on God to help you!

The Bible encourages everyone to "Trust in the Lord with all your heart And lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths." Proverbs 3:5-6 NKJV.

Second, "When I am Afraid," I Pray to God! v 9 (Prayer) - Prayer is vital in living a victorious Christian life.

David said, when I am afraid, "My enemies will retreat when I call to you for help. This I know: God is on my side!" Psalm 56:9 NLT. "Then my enemies will turn back in the day when I call" Psalm 56:9 AMP.

If you are scared because of the uncertain future or extreme difficulties, call on the LORD. When Jeremiah, the Weeping Prophet, was experiencing difficult time, he called on God. The LORD told him, 'Call to Me and I will answer you and tell you [and even show you] great and mighty things, [things which have been confined and hidden], which you do not know and understand and cannot distinguish.' Jeremiah 33:3 AMP.

If you are afraid and do not know the LORD personally and in need of salvation, the Bible says, for 'whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' Romans 10:13 NKJV.

Our Loving God is always available anytime, anywhere, and in any place. He will NOT abandon or forsake you. He loves you so much. When you are afraid, please pray to God right now!

Third, "When I am Afraid," I Praise the LORD! – vv. 4, 10 (Worship) - The psalmist said, "I praise God for what he has promised. I trust in God, so why should I be afraid? What can mere mortals do to me?" Psalm 56:4 NLT. "I praise God for what he has promised; yes, I praise the Lord for what he has promised." Psalm 56:10 NLT.

The psalmist said, "¹⁶ Come and hear, all who fear God [and worship Him with awe-inspired reverence and obedience], And I will tell what He has done for me. ¹⁷ I cried aloud to Him; He was highly praised with my tongue." Psalm 66:16-17 AMP.

When Paul and Silas were imprisoned in the dark dungeon, instead of pouting, they praised God! The Philippian jailer and all the people who heard them were completely amazed. Doctor Luke recorded their story in Acts 16:22-30 AMP.

²² The crowd also joined in the attack against them, and the chief magistrates tore their robes off them and ordered that Paul and

Silas be beaten with rods. ²³ After striking them many times [with the rods], they threw them into prison, commanding the jailer to guard them securely. ²⁴ He, having received such a [strict] command, threw them into the inner prison (dungeon) and fastened their feet in the stocks [in an agonizing position].

²⁵ But about midnight when Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns of praise to God, and the prisoners were listening to them;
²⁶ suddenly there was a great earthquake, so [powerful] that the very foundations of the prison were shaken and at once all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. ²⁷ When the jailer, shaken out of sleep, saw the prison doors open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, thinking that the prisoners had escaped.
²⁸ But Paul shouted, saying, "Do not hurt yourself, we are all here!" ²⁹ Then the jailer called for torches and rushed in, and trembling with fear he fell down before Paul and Silas, ³⁰ and after he brought them out [of the inner prison], he said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

Instead of being so scared of darkness and death, they praised the LORD! They have the eternal light within them that shines brighter in their darkest in life's journey.

People today including our beloved veterans and active-duty service members and family members are experiencing "darkness" in their lives. They are fearful in various ways. Our VFW team members can offer or find ways to help our fellow strugglers.

For more than 36 years (1855-1891), the Old Point Loma Lighthouse stood watch over the entrance to San Diego Bay, the southwest most part of the U.S.A. The lighthouse has been a welcome sight for scared sailors traveling through the Bay. Nevertheless, the marine layers and the low clouds often concealed the light. Today, a new lighthouse is guiding the fearful seafarers leading them to safety.

In a Christian community, our Lord Jesus Christ said, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness but have the light of life" John 8:12 NKJV. Our Lord encourages us to - "Let your

light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in heaven" Matt 5:16 MEV.

In **summary**, God did and continues to do His part by helping us when we experience darkness in life's journey. Now we must do our part like what David, the psalmist, did.

- (1) The psalmist fulfills his promise to God: V 12 "I will fulfill my vows to you, O God, and will offer a sacrifice of thanks for your help."
- (2) God's answer: V 13a "For you have rescued me from death; you have kept my feet from slipping."
- (3) The result of trusting God: So now I can walk in your presence, O God, in your Life-giving Light.




