

#### A Memorial Day Message: Red Poppy Flower, Symbol of Sacrifice and Freedom

For more than thirty-four years, Memorial Day has brought (and continues to bring) surreal experiences for me as a former active-duty service member and now as veteran and serving as a VFW Post 7907 Chaplain. It seems unreal to think of so many, many braved warriors giving their lives including the ones I had an honor to serve with in combat zone and in garrison. Each one holds a special memory and will always be in my heart.

One of the places I had an honor to serve was Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples, Italy. During my service in NSA Naples, I lost my fellow active duty and good friend, **Chaplain John Keith**, a Southern Baptist chaplain that I recruited and helped in his Navy service. John's final resting place is at **Riverside National Cemetery**. I try to visit him and **George Thornton**, MGYST, USMC Ret., during special holidays or services.

Every springtime in southern Italy is one of my favorite times of the year. Perennial plants that have been quiescent during winter months begin to feel the warmth of the spring weather. Various varieties of beautiful and colorful flowers begin to bloom. Bulb plants launch above the ground ready to face the blue sky. Native European and migratory birds sing and enjoy the rising of the sun and the flowers all around the meadows and mountains. Almost overnight new leaves appear in the Italian cherry tree, a common spring flowering tree of the garden. Beautiful flowers of countless colors begin to bloom including the **red poppy**.

During springtime in the United States of America, the red poppies show up as well. The red poppy is not just an ordinary variety of flower. The red poppy (Scientific classification as "Papaver rhoeas") known as common poppy, corn poppy, corn rose, field poppy, and Flanders poppy, decorates the Italian landscapes.

For me the red poppy has a patriotic meaning and spiritual symbol. Red symbolizes the blood of warriors who fought for freedom from the ancient era to modern times.

From a Christian standpoint, the red symbolizes the blood of the Savior Jesus Christ. He served, suffered, shed His blood, and died to save mankind from their sins.

The Apostle Paul said to the Romans: "For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life." Romans 5:10 KJV. The Apostle John the Beloved said, "My dear children, I am writing this to you so that you will not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate who pleads our case before the Father. He is Jesus Christ, the one who is truly righteous. <sup>2</sup> He himself is the sacrifice that atones for our sins—and not only our sins but the sins of all the world." 1 John 2:1-2 NLT. The Apostle Peter said, "Christ suffered for our sins once for all time. He never sinned, but he died for sinners to bring you safely home to God. He suffered physical death, but he was raised to life in the Spirit. 1 Peter 3:18 NLT

From a patriotic standpoint, red symbolizes the blood of warriors who fought for freedom from the ancient era to modern times. Throughout the ages, soldiers fought, shed blood, and many, many died fighting for freedom.

Thirty minutes north of Naval Support Activity Naples, Support Site, is the place called "Capua." Rome's Coliseum was modeled after the arena in Capua, the training ground of the famed Thracian gladiator Spartacus who together with fellow gladiators shed blood fighting for their freedom against the slave-owning oligarchy during the Roman period.

Fast forward to World War I, the "War to End All Wars," claimed the lives of 9 million combatants and 7 million civilians. More than a hundred years ago the red poppies adorned the war-torn areas all over Europe including France. Honoring and remembering his friend Lieutenant Alexis Helmer who was killed during WWI on May 2, 1915, near Ypres, France, Doctor, Poet, and Artillery Commander Major John McCrae wrote a poem:

"In Flanders fields" In Flanders fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below. We are the Dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders fields. Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high. If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow. In Flanders fields.

In the United States, Americans usually wear red poppies as the symbolic red flowers on Memorial Day—the last Monday in May (it's 29 May in 2023)—to commemorate the sacrifice of so many men and women who have given their lives fighting for their country.

Every time I see each red poppy, it represents a precious soul of warrior/veteran who sheds his or her blood for freedom's sake. We must never forget their sacrifices for freedom's sake.

Today, hundreds of thousands of our troops serve on the home front and around the globe. When you visit the **Poway Veterans**Park, you can see in a circle at the middle of the Park the saying, "All gave some, and some gave all!" Our brave warriors fought for flag, family, and faith.

This year, some of us celebrate Memorial Day on foreign soil. Let us always be mindful of the warriors who left America's shore and never return. They gave their lives! Italy has two National Cemeteries






